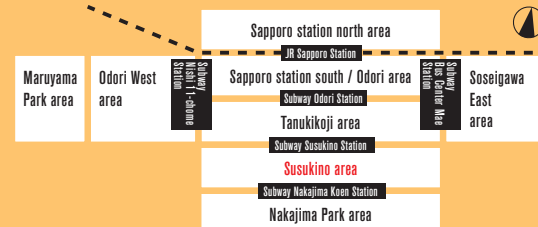

Susukino is said to be the largest entertainment district north of Tokyo. The town started as a brothel created by the Meiji government and flourished as an entertainment district with the economic development of Sapporo. Susukino is actually a temple town of Sapporo. Unlike at night, Susukino during the day is a place where one can hear sutra chanting and visit temples to obtain various Goshuin, red ink stamps, or observe daily goma ceremonies. In addition, the streets you casually walk through at night are lined with numerous art works and houses that have been designated as tangible cultural properties by the national government. Walking through the alleyways, you will be tempted to explore the Showa-era atmosphere of the drinking district. In the entertainment district of Susukino, there are many places where you can enjoy music with your drinks. Sometimes it is a good idea to find such a place to enjoy music.



The "Sapporo Burari Techo" was created by members affiliated with tourism business in Sapporo who gathered under the name "Sapporo Concierge." For over six months, members held workshops, split into groups by area and held numerous discussions. They imagined they were tourists and actually walked the streets of towns and cities in search of appeal and charm they wished to convey to others, and compiled their findings into this handbook. The "Sapporo Burari Techo" has carefully selected attractive stores, shops, and more that one would find if living in Sapporo, and incorporated these into the various courses introduced, so visitors can be excited as they venture around Sapporo to discover the wonders it has to offer. It is our hope that you will discover and enjoy new and unordinary charm of Sapporo.

Susukino Teramachi

Susukino is also the temple town of Sapporo. Shrines and temples were "indispensable" to the people of the pioneer days. Therefore, shrines and temples were built in Susukino, which was the outer part of the city center at that time, and still remain today.

Visitors can visit shrines and temples in Susukino and collect Goshuin, red ink stamps, or observe daily goma ceremonies.



Susukino Market and Zerobanchi

In the middle of the entertainment district Susukino, there is an old building with the sign, Susukino Market. The building is more than 70 years old. In the basement is "Susukino Zerobanchi," the first underground restaurant district in Hokkaido.

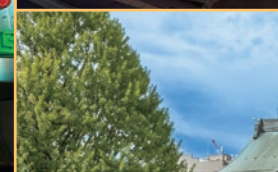
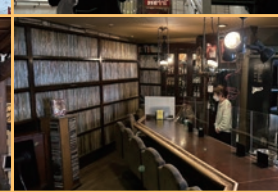
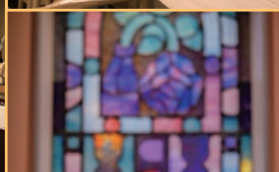

Susukino, the City of Music

Another characteristic of Susukino is that there are many music bars, including jazz bars.

Some of them have a history of over 50 years and have seen the people and bubble era of Susukino.

Why not spend a night in Susukino while listening to beautiful music?



●Zerobanchi

1 Susukino Zerobanchi, located in the basement of 6 Susukino Market, is an eating and drinking district that has been in existence since the 1960s. The oldest is "Satchon," a snack bar. About 30 establishments are in business, including "Akatsukian," where you can enjoy both Sobamae (small dishes that you can lightly eat while drinking sake before soba noodles) and handmade buckwheat noodles to finish the meal. Other eateries and pubs include "Hareruya," where you can enjoy heated sake, a la carte dishes, and Rock, "Kashimiya," a small sake and wine bar, and "Café&Bar 0-banchi Coffee," famous for its "master," or owner. The 24-hour "Nigirimeshi" on the first floor is also a must-try!



●Sushi

Sushi is the best way to enjoy seafood in Susukino. A wide variety of sushi restaurants are scattered throughout the area, from those that boast freshness typical of Hokkaido to those that are particular about the work they do.

If you are looking for a talented restaurant, "Susukino Sushikin," "Maru Sushi," and "Ueno" are recommended. "Saikou", "9 Tanaka", "Tenchijin", and "Koise" are also very active restaurants (reservations are required for each and only omakase is available). "Ichii," "Natsume," and "Hinoki" are recommended restaurants where you can happily order your favorite. "Chokotto Sushi" is a stand-up sushi restaurant, and "Kaitenzushi Pasaru" is a local favorite.

Susukino Art and Mystery Architecture Tour

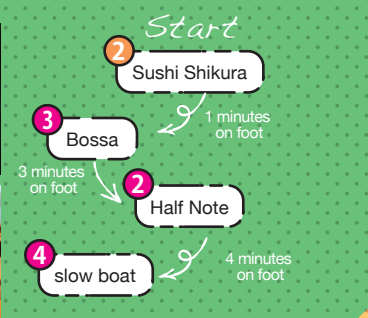
