The Central Park of Sapporo, where you can enjoy the four seasons

Nakajima Park was originally an islet surrounded by the Toyohira River and its tributary, the Kamokamo River.

Shobu Pond in the park was created as a lumber yard to accumulate lumber cut down in the upper reaches of the Ishikari River during the settlement of the area. The Shobu pond is a pathway for citizens enjoying boating in summer and for animals in winter as the surface of the water freezes over.

The area along the Kamokamo River, the origin of Nakajima Park, is characterized by its beautiful seasonal expressions, such as cherry blossoms in spring and autumn leaves in fall.

The lush green park is also home to the Hoheikan, a historical building, Kitara, a







Nakajima Park presents a different look every day. In spring, cherry blossoms bloom along the Kamokamo River; in late May, lilacs bloom and you can take a walk among the wisteria trellises; in June, fresh greenery blooms; in summer, you can enjoy boating Shobu Pond. In autumn, a walk along the ginkgo trees is recommended.

And in winter, the best time to visit is in the morning. White snowfields and the clear air is a scene we would like you to experience








Famous restaurants

The Nakajima Park area is home to a variety of famous restaurants that are frequented by food connoisseurs from all over the country in search of the best of Japanese cuisine.

Reservations are required for "Nukumi," which offers seasonal Japanese cuisine beautiful vessels, and "Shimo Yamite Na Izuru," which treats diners to a free-flowing fusion of Hokkaido seafood and other dishes. This is a gastronomic experience that you won't want to miss.

"Ohkami Soup" is a specialty miso ramen restaurant that specializes only in miso ramen, so be prepared to wait in line for a bowl of their special soup!
