Maruyama Park area

If you wish to fully experience the central part of Sapporo, we suggest you take a trip to the Maruyama area.

Maruyama Koen Station is just 10 minutes on the Tozai Subway Line from Odori Station, the heart of Sapporo. One step out onto the street and you are welcomed with a view of Hokkaido Shrine and the lush greenery of Maruyama Park where you will encounter little Ezo squirrels.

You only have to walk a short distance to backstreets inside the residential area to discover numerous hidden cafés, restaurants, and little boutiques that showcase unique home goods. Relax and enjoy a cup of coffee and sweet dessert while you gaze at the greenery, or enjoy a leisurely meal at one of the many restaurants. You will surely be amazed that just 10 minutes from the heart of downtown there is such a lovely place to enjoy. Each season brings its own beauty and characteristics; in spring the cherry blossoms, in summer the rich greenery, in fall the gorgeous colors of foliage, and in winter the sparkling snow on the trees is mesmerizing. There are so many nooks and crannies to explore and search for cafés, restaurants, and boutiques that challenge you to discover their whereabouts, that no matter how many times you visit, you are sure to discover something new each time.

Recommended Spots

The Rich Forests of Hokkaido Jingu Shrine and Maruyama Park

Nestled in thick old-grown forests sits Hokkaido Shrine. Built in 1869 (Meiji 2), the Kaitaku Sanshin (deity) was enshrined, and it was designated the protective deity by the Meiji Emperor during the reclamation and development of Hokkaido. Since then it has been revered and worshiped by many as the main guardian of Hokkaido.



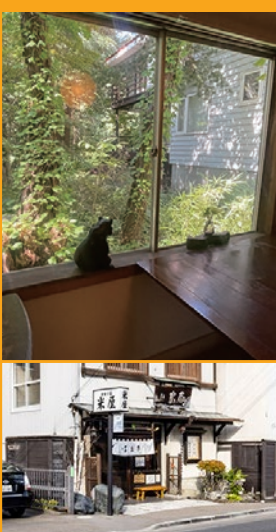
The vast premises of the shrine covers approximately 18,000 square meters, scattered with 1,400 cherry trees and approximately 250 plum trees that all blossom at once in spring. During the summer the numerous trees provide shade and serenity. The ginkgo and maples change to vivid yellows and reds in the fall, and when the leaves finally drop and winter sets in, the trees and grounds are covered in a blanket of pure white snow, creating a solemn and surreal atmosphere.

Maruyama Park which borders Hokkaido Shrine was built at the beginning of the Meiji period by the Hokkaido Development Commission as a testing area for trees, but by the end of the Meiji period and beginning of the Taisho period it was landscaped as a park. Today it is one of the main gathering spots for citizens of Hokkaido.

The expansive premises houses the athletic facilities such as the Maruyama Baseball Field, Athletic Field, Sakashita Grand, and old growth forests the habitat of many wild birds and Ezo squirrels.

Specialty stores scattered throughout the residential area and Urasando Shopping Arcade

The Maruyama area, which is a little distanced from the heart of Sapporo, was once an agricultural area. Urasando Shopping Arcade which began as the Maruyama Morning Market, is packed with unique eateries featuring delicious foods, drinks, sweets, breads, as well as exquisite shopping options for interesting sundries and home goods. In the residential area behind Urasando Shopping Arcade and the high rise condominiums that line the street, are old houses and buildings that were renovated into numerous cafés and confectioneries, boutiques, and little "by reservation only" restaurants that provide for a fun-filled day.



●Myriad of Individualistic Shops

Maruyama is a popular residential area known for its many attractive stores. We recommend finding souvenirs for yourself here. "14 Foods Variety Sugihara" is an exciting grocery store that carries a wide variety of hard-to-get delicious items from around Hokkaido. The "2 Fresh Factory" is a grocer that carries the choicest vegetables, fruits, and processed foods. Their carefully selected foods express the love and dedication they have for quality foods! "12 Cheese Conte" carries a large selection of specialty Hokkaido cheeses, as well as raisins and crackers.



●Lunch Guide

Here we introduce all of the lunch options in the Maruyam area from cheap eateries to high-end restaurants. "Shina Soba Chiu" serves seductively delicious ramen noodles, while if you are in the mood for seafood donburi, you want to head to "Hanashiya Pub," which offers the highest quality of seafood for a pub. For a salmon specialty store there is the "Sake Mabushi Omusubi Kametaro," directly managed by the "Marukame Maruyama Main Store," and which sells a wide variety of salmon rice balls. The menu items are mostly to go, so you can grab a lunch and enjoy it at Maruyama Park. The "Wake Café" offers a great selection of food items; it will be a toss up between the Napolitan pasta and the Vegetable Donburi! It is also open day and night!
